


Game Reserves

Game Reserves are categories of wildlife protected areas which are declared for the purpose of conservation. Both consumptive and non-consumptive wildlife utilization are allowed after permit has been obtained from the Director of TAWA (*Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority*). No human activities are allowed, unless, with permit granted by the Director of TAWA.

Management of game Reserve

TAWA is mandated to implement the Wildlife Conservation Act No. 5 of 2009 and subsequent regulations to ensure that wildlife resources available outside TANAPA and NCAA are properly conserved.



In response to the rapid rise in wildlife crime, including poaching and illegal ivory trade, rhino horn and other animal product experienced in Tanzania that lead to the consequent decline in wildlife populations, especially of African elephants,

Principal Activities of TAWA in Game Reserves

TAWA is strive to reinforce law enforcement by conducting Anti-poaching patrols, protection of human and their properties against problem

Coverage of Game Reserves in Tanzania

Currently, Tanzania has the following Game reserves;
